Dear Members and Friends of First Presbyterian Church of Harbor Springs,

On June 13, Pastor Kip Murphy announced to session that he had received and accepted a call to First Presbyterian Church of Mason City, Iowa. It was then that our church became a church in transition. The Presbytery stepped in to assist and Rev. Dr. Lois Arioian became our Committee on Ministry (COM) Representative to guide us through the transitional process.

Your Session, with help from our COM Representative, is working to carry on the ministry of the congregation as we look forward to the next stage in our congregation's life together. 1) Session is securing guest speakers to fill the pulpit and provide pastoral care during the immediate vacancy until a transitional pastor is found. Rev. Tom Cook has agreed to fill this need. He will preach on August 27, most Sunday's in September and will provide pastoral care as needed. 2) Session has appointed a three person Transitional Team made up of Chairman Jerry Root, Kathy Bodzick and Sue Blevins. This team has the responsibly of finding a transitional pastor to serve in the interim. A transitional pastor is someone with special expertise and training in working with congregations in the midst of pastoral transition.

When the church is ready, the Presbytery will authorize the congregation to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee (Search Committee). The Session will recommend the number os persons to serve on this Committee. The Nominating Committee will prepare a slate to be voted on by the congregation. A congregational meeting will be called and the members of the Search Committee will be approved and commissioned to begin prayerful process of searching for and nominating a pastor to be elected by the congregation.

We hope you will join us in this process: by supporting the church, welcoming a transitional pastor, praying for the Search Committee as they seek to determine God's will and finally, by helping us to elect a permanently installed pastor to serve at First Presbyterian Church in Harbor Springs.

There are no questions about a well-known statistic in church growth circles. By far and away, the most potent church growth comes when members of a church openly and often invite friends and neighbors to attend worship and church activities with them. It is called the "with-me" principle. It goes far beyond just growing a church, in fact more importantly it was Jesus' approach to developing disciples. Jesus used the "with-me" principle often with his disciples and in his ministry. Just about wherever he went he brought disciples and others with him.

Jesus taught his disciples mostly by example... he brought them along with him and they watched and learned how he could heal, feed and witness to any number of folks. His classroom was the world, and he brought his disciples into it "with-him." Then he sent them out on a pilot mission in pairs, two by two, so that one would be with another in supporting roles as they witnessed to the world. (Mark 6:6-13) When they returned, they told Jesus all they had done and taught. They were amazed by what they were able to accomplish. Then Jesus said to them: "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest." (Mark 6:31)

How I ended up in the ministry has everything to do with the "with-me" principle. I spent two years studying biology at Alma College. For reasons I need not explain, I took a religion course my sophomore year and got hooked by a professor who played me like a trout to the net. He took me with him for two and a half years. Another teacher took me with him my junior year. One day, while we walked to class together, the second professor told me the church needed people like me in the ministry. I changed my major to religion that year and ended up in Divinity School. Upon graduation, I entered the ministry as an associate pastor in a large church and my colleague, the senior minister, took me alongside, with him, teaching me by example and all the while I experienced conversion and my calling into the ministry became clearer to me. Since those days I have become a mentor to many people, some of whom are now ordained as teaching elders and ruling elders.

So my question to you is who are you bringing with you? Is there a friend? A grandchild? Your own children? A neighbor? Someone you haven't seen in worship for a while? Who will you bring with you to experience the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ?

New Bible Study to Begin!





When Labor Day started

Labor Day was first celebrated unofficially by labor activists and individual states in the late 1800s, according to the US Department of Labor. New York was the first state to introduce a bill recognizing Labor Day, but Oregon was the first to actually codify it into law in 1887. Colorado, Massachusetts, New Jersey and New York had followed suit by the end of 1887.

It wasn't until June 28, 1894, that Congress passed an act naming the first day of September a legal holiday called Labor Day.

Today, Labor Day weekend marks the unofficial end of summer, but workeroriented Labor Day parades and festivities are still part of the federal holiday.
